TRAINERS TIPS

We can all use a little help once in a while and we know where we can find them so here is a new part to our newsletter. We will be asking trainers to share some of their winning secrets with us. We're going to start with Justin and Tricia Seubert, Legacy Lane Stables on some hints with what they do to keep their Halter Horse Ready to go for any show!

We at Legacy Lane Stables have a pretty regimented grooming program in place that works for us. Although our horses do see the outdoors (are turned out some each day during show season to be a horse... for their own piece of mind), Justin and I try to keep them out of the "heat of the day" to protect their coat and the color(s) from fading or turning. Our horses are kept clipped and sheeted to alleviate the build up of dust on their coats when stalled. We feel grooming is a must all year long for our Halter Horses, not only is it a good time to look over, check, and feel the horse - the horse enjoys the companionship and "rub down." By keeping up on the horses grooming needs, come show time, there won't be too much extra work involved.
